



2016 PURPLE CAP CRAFTING GUIDELINES

Thank you for paying close attention!

Parents select their favorite hat from the dozens that are on display in their birth centers. The most popular hats have common characteristics. These guidelines will increase the likelihood of YOUR hat going home with a family.

YARN

Hats that are either KNITTED or CROCHETED will need to be made with new, clean, SOFT-TO-THE-TOUCH and WASHABLE yarn.

*“VALUE” yarns are sometimes scratchy and tend not to be selected by new parents.
Test softness on your cheek if you’re unsure!*

SIZE

Of the THOUSANDS of beautifully hand crafted *PURPLE* caps that are donated each year, many hundreds cannot be used because the size is either too big or too small. These hats will be worn by 1 or 2 day old infants. The average newborn head circumference is 14” (13”– 15”) and hats should be approximately 4-6” high.

COLOR

Hats NEED to be **50%** or more of any shade of *PURPLE* (for the *Period of PURPLE Crying*).

Please help us meet families’ requests for more “BOY-FRIENDLY” hats by considering patterns with darker purples, and stripes of blue, orange, green, or gray.

STYLE

Please use EITHER: all Gender-Neutral (Unisex) styles OR: an equal number of Girl-Friendly and Boy-Friendly styles.

SAFETY

Please help us keep babies safe from choking and strangulation risks:

PLEASE DO NOT ATTACH DECORATIONS: pom-poms, tassels, straps, bows, ribbons, buttons, etc.

WARMTH

These hats keep babies’ heads warm outdoors during the colder winter months. Smaller stitches result in a warmer hat. The large, loose stitches (typically made by looms) tend not to provide enough warmth.

LOOMS

This type of knitting is allowed, but should be used with caution. Please ensure that the caps are not too LOOSE or too TIGHT for a comfortable fit around the baby’s head.
